Brothers and Sisters.

In recent weeks, we've received many questions in regards to the upcoming International Convention in Spokane, Washington, and we wanted to take a moment to clarify a few things moving forward.

First, as of right now, the International Convention is still scheduled to take place. If the status of the Convention changes per the orders of the state of Washington, we will let all of you know as quickly as possible through all of our available communication channels.

Second, in regards to Banquet/Prayer Breakfast ticket sales, any payments made <u>WILL</u> be refunded in <u>FULL</u> in the event the Convention is cancelled or if the Convention continues in a limited capacity that does not permit us to hold banquets. The same applies to fees related to Pre-registration or Ritual competition. Because we understand the uncertainty in these times, the deadline to purchase banquet tickets has been extended to June 30.

We would also like to take a moment to encourage everyone to visit the Conventions page at foe.com for an updated list of cancelled/postponed State/Provincial Conventions. If your State or Province has cancelled or postponed your upcoming Convention but that information is not reflected on foe.com, please let us know as soon as possible so we can keep our list up to date for your fellow members.

Per Section 35.4 of the Grand Aerie Constitution & Statutes: "The State or Provincial Aeries shall meet in annual session previous to the Grand Aerie Sessions," so States/Provinces may need to be innovative in how they accomplish the statutory requirements in the event you are unable to hold your traditional Convention prior to July 18.

As always; we will continue to monitor these situations and keep you up-to-speed on any updates as they're made available.

Please stay safe. We can't wait to see you all again on the Eagle Trail very soon!



From BC Provincial Madam Treasurer, Judy McMillan:



Hello Fellow Eagles, <u>As</u> you may have already heard, due to Provincial COVID-19 requirements, and following the example set by our Brothers in both Alaska and Washington States, the B.C. Provincial Aerie Executive has voted in Session to cancel the 2020 Provincial Aerie Convention in Cranbrook. Following edicts issued by Grand Aerie for Local and Provincial/State Aeries, we will proceed to carry on with steps required by our Provincial Aerie Executive Board.

A series of Special Meetings may be required to continue to conduct the business of the Provincial Aerie for the balance of the current term. Much of the transition from this term to next will be handled as best it can, and our Provincial Aerie members are available to help you and your Local Aerie wade through your local challenges to hopefully thrive in the very near future.

Continued From BC Provincial Aerie Secretary, Will Heigh:

As much as we can in regard to normalcy, the need for us all to pay our Dues for next year by the end of this month remains of paramount importance. Many Aeries have implemented dues payments by drop-offs at the Local Aerie, surface-mailed cheques and money orders, as well as eTransfers from your bank directly to your Aerie's General Account. In these sensitive and trying times, the survivals of all Eagles Aeries have been jeopardized, and the Dues Payments are one simple way to help your Aerie keep going.

Proposed amendments to the Provincial By-Laws will be circulated to all Local Aerie Secretaries within the next few days. We ask that Local Aerie Presidents at their next meeting; either by email/conference call/Zoom, etc. form some consensus as to whether their Aerie votes in support of, or votes against, these proposed amendments. 

OUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

- ${\bf Q}$ Can an Interviewing Committee Member with draw an application?
- $A \underline{No}$; Section 1.6 of the Rules and Regulations states in part; The Interviewing Committee may not withdraw an application if the application is found unfavorable. $\underline{Only\ the\ proposer\ or\ applicant}}$ can withdraw the application before the report of the Interviewing Committee to the Auxiliary
- **Q** Does the Auxiliary have to accept the "Golden Eagle" as part of her transferring into an Auxiliary? **A No: A** Golden Age Eagle Membership from one Auxiliary to another is non-transferrable. Once they have been transferred, if your By-Laws allow, they can reapply for Golden Age Eagle Membership in your Auxiliary.
- **Q** Can the Auxiliary charge her for her portion of the per capita of Grand and the provincial per capita? **A** Section 2.9 of the Rules and Regulations states in part: The Local Auxiliary may provide in its By-Laws that such members shall pay applicable per capita taxes and funeral benefits.
